Re: Exemption from franchise tax

Gentlemen:

It is the opinion of this office, based upon the evidence presented, that you are exempt from State franchise tax under the provisions of Section 23701d of the Revenue and Taxation Code, as it is shown that you are organized and operated exclusively as an educational organization.

Accordingly, you will not be required to file franchise tax returns unless you change the character of your organization, the purposes for which you were organized, or your method of operation. Any such changes should be reported immediately to this office in order that their effect upon your exempt status may be determined.

If in any year your gross income exceeds \$25,000, you are required to file an information return on Form 199 on or before the 15th day of the 5th month following the close of your fiscal year. These forms will be mailed to you if you provide us with your current postal address.

If you have income from an unrelated trade or business that is taxable under the provisions of Section 23731 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, you must file a return on Form 109 on or before the 15th day of the 3rd month following the close of your fiscal year. Copies of this form may be obtained from this office or any of its branches.

Contributions made to you are deductible by the donors in arriving at their taxable net income in the manner and to the extent provided by Sections 17214, 17215, 17216, and 24357 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

If the organization is not yet incorporated or has not yet qualified to do business in California, this approval will expire unless incorporation or qualification is completed within 30 days.

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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of the St

AERO ASSOCIATION OF CALTECH

The following are Articles of Incorporation executed for the purpose of incorporating a non-profit corporation under Title I, Division 2, Part 1 of the Corporations Code of the State of California.

FIRST: The name of this corporation shall be AERO ASSOCIATION OF CALTECH

SECOND:

- (a) The specific and primary purpose for which this corporation is organized and operated is to promote interest in general aviation among the California Institute of Technology community, including its students, staff and faculty.
- (b) The general purposes for which this corporation is formed are to own or lease aircraft to be used by its members for educational purposes only and to educate its members in flying aircraft, in the maintenance thereof, and in safety precautions in connection therewith, and to foster and promote a knowledge of, understanding of and love for aviation in general among its members.
- (c) This corporation shall have and exercise all rights and powers conferred on corporations under the laws of the State of California, provided, however, that this corporation is not empowered to engage in any activity which in itself is not

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in furtherance of its purposes as set forth in subparagraphs (a) and (b) of this Article Second.

- (d) This corporation is not organized or operated, nor shall ever be operated, for a profit.
- (e) No part of the net earnings, peoperties or assets of this corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of any private person or individual or any member or director of this corporation and on liquidation or dissolution all properties and assets of this corporation remaining after paying or providing for all debts and obligations shall be distributed and paid over to such fund, foundation or corporation organized and operated for charitable, scientific or educational purposes as the board of directors shall determine.
- (f) This corporation shall not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation. This corporation shall not participate in nor intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

THIRD: The county in the state of California

where the principal office for the transaction of the business

of this corporation is to be located is the County of Los Angeles.

FOURTH:

(a) The powers of this corporation shall be exercised, its properties controlled and its affairs conducted by a board of directors. The number of directors of this corporation shall be five (5). The number of directors herein

provided for may be changed by a bylaw duly adopted by the members entitled to vote.
